

Often public schools in the Philippines have a made appeals to church groups to help!

Although the Philippine government pays the ratio of one teacher for 50-75 students. This salaries of public school teachers (from taxes) without sometimes increases when teachers are sick, to any direct financial obligation to the students, there is a 1/100, as classes are combined. BLC's campus-usage fee demanded from each student, teacher/student ratio is 1/15 (plus aides) for including needs for funds for field trips, special events preschool and 1/30 (plus aides) for elemenary and lacking classroom appliances. Added to this is the school levels. As the Philippine population has need to purchase uniforms, books, pens, pencils, etc., exploded, with only slight increases in the nation's and the destitute families who are struggling to find education budget, even the president (Estrada) has funds to put food on the table are not able to provide the needed funds for their "free" public schooling.

"Rugby boys" are street kids who come from poor families who can't afford to keep their kids in public schools. They sniff rubber cement (called "rugby") as a way to bide their time. Also they may scrub their families' clothes by hand, beg on the streets, or just sit around and wait until evening when their parents get home from scrounging to find work. When families enroll their children in BLC's free Christian school, their lifestyles change along with each family's educational/spiritual aptitude.
