IN GOD'S TIME

"Pastor, my daughter just graduated from grade 6 at BLC. Will BLC have a high school next year?"

This has been the question on the minds of parents, staff and sponsors for the past month.

During BLC's February annual inspection by the Philippine Department of Education, the inspector stated, "This institution is high school caliber!" Yet once we submitted the paperwork for a high school, there were two drawbacks:

- We have reached full capacity in our classrooms
- 2) The paperwork for a high school should have been submitted last September.

I came up with a plan to solve challenge #1, if the government will waive challenge #2. If we move the preschool and pre-4th grade elementary school an hour earlier, then we'd have dual sessions.

Session #1 would be 6:30am-12:30 noon, and session #2 would be 1:30 pm- 7:30 pm. Since there is no Junior High School in the Philippines, high school begins in 7th grade.

There are both pros and cons for this approach. Cons include a longer day for our bus

drivers, as well as increased electrical usage. No new teachers would need to be employed though, since some of the elementary grades are now so greatly populated that they have 2 teachers, occupying 2 classrooms. By decreasing the population of these grades and adding high school, we would transfer those "extra" teachers to teach high school classes. But the pros far outweigh the cons. Positive factors of my proposal include:

- A) Alleviation of the overcrowded classrooms and vehicles: by decreasing the number of pre-4th graders and opening high school, we would maintain the same size student body, at 500 children.
- B) The families who have proven their ability to abide by BLC's guidelines are those who have made it through 6th grade, and thus have a lower dropout rate. This keeps the integrity of BLC favorable in the records of the government, as well as for the sponsors and parents.
- C) With less students per session, the space on the BLC campus can be fully utilized by each class. Instead of being cramped in one

D) the most obvious advantage is that these poor families, who cannot afford to pay for their children to attend school, can continue their kids' education.

However, if the government determines that we must wait one more year before opening high school, then the parents will either have to keep their children out of school for one year, or else borrow money from friends and family to pay for public high school this year only, and then when we open the first two grades of high school in 2010, they'll enroll their kids in the 2nd year of high school. All will be done in God's perfect timing.

How does this fit into the "Big Picture" of our overall plan? In 1996, God gave me a vision for His plan here in Davao. Part of that plan was to build a teacher training college and also to train high school graduates to become church planters.

By training these children from preschool through elementary, high school and college, we then can ensure placement for their lifetime occupations, planting churches, converting the lost, and also building a high-quality, Christian staff for the bright future of BLC.
