WHAT MISSIONARIES DO

Missionaries travel all over the world, changing lives by introducing lost souls to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ.

Cultures around the globe differ, yet all human beings have a similar need: to be saved from sin through the blood of Jesus.

Therefore, as missionaries leave the countries of their birth, they analyze ways to effectively share the life-changing Gospel message.

Not only are worldwide cultures diverse, but so are the talents and gifts of the missionaries themselves.

So sit back and allow me to present "A Weekday in the Life of the Barners"...

3am: BIBLE LISTENING:

With the Bible on tape, Paul grabs his sneakers and dons his headphones to listen to the Bible for an hour while jogging 4-5 miles.

4am: BIBLE LISTENING:

Still with his headphones on, Paul dons his helmet, bike sneaks and gloves to bicycle 5-10 miles.

5am: FAMILY DEVOTIONS:

While Elvie wakes PJ and Abigail for school, Paul calls prayer partners worldwide on the MagicJack free internet phone, since early morning



in the Philippines is evening in the USA. After the kids have eaten breakfast and are ready for school,

the family reads the Bible, prays and sings, for our "Family Altar Time".

6am: DOWNTOWN:

While Paul drives the kids to school, Elvie prepares her paperwork for a new school day, and has her own TAWG (Time Alone With God).

7-9am: PRAYER TIME/STAFF TIME:

After dropping off the kids at school, Paul starts his prayer time at the fitness club. During each lap he swims, he prays for family, school faculty, staff, church volunteers and prayer partners worldwide (YOU). Then he does downtown work: banking, mailing, hardware purchases for the school, BCA- related bill payments, and grocery shopping.

Meanwhile, after flag raising, Elvie leads the staff devotions at school, prays and counsels parents and students, reviews the lesson plans and daily journals of the teachers, and meets with visitors and textbook



salespeople who drop by the campus. If there is a need to visit Government Education offices, she drives downtown and we combine it with a lunch date together. On Tuesdays and Fridays, we'll visit ministerial or civic meetings together. It is also a time for us to do hospital and home visitation for congregational members in need, and door-todoor evangelism.

10-11am: OFFICE TIME: While PJ and Abby are studying in the missionary school,

Elvie and I are visiting the classrooms at Barner Christian Academy. Also in my office, I'll study theology books for Sunday's message, as well as for other upcoming volunteer speaking engagements (averaging five per week).

NOON: LUNCH BREAK

<u>1-3pm: OFFICE TIME:</u> Early afternoon is communications time. Letters from sponsored students to their sponsors (and vice versa) are passed through the school secretaries and then checked and prepared for mailing. Other communications are also prepared: weekly email diaries, monthly PEPPER prayer letter, and annual Barner Book Diary.

4-6pm: FAMILY TIME: Daily, different events take our evenings: Monday-Eatout/Tuesday-"3-B's" (our three pastors' Familes meet together for prayer, games and food at the school)/Wednesday-Prayer Meeting/Thursday-Family Date Night/Friday-Family sports & games **7-8pm: HOMEWORK:** Since Paul wakes up early, he goes to bed while Elvie leads the kids in their homework (waking up Dad if they need his help).

<u>9pm: DAY'S END:</u> Dad is awoken so that all can pray, read the Bible, and sing together. The kids are tucked in and the day is done. As some homeless people are presently with us in the household, they too share in the excitement of missionary life.
