The task was a big one. First, we had to go over to the other school and analyze what the other uniforms looked like. The school did not have a template to go by, yet our BCA treasurer Minmin is handy with a sewing machine, and she took on the project.

Actually, only eighteen uniforms had to be made (for the girls), since the boys' outfits were pretty simple: just a pair of store-bought dark pants, and a short-sleeved white shirt. We did have to buy the school logo's patch to sew onto the pockets, however.

Just when we thought that our task would be simple, Elvie stopped by the office of the principal of the other school. He informed her, "Oh, by the

way, you need all the BCA students who are taking classes in our school to be fully "suited-up" in our school uniform in TWO WEEKS!"

The ladies on our BCA faculty and staff got busy and purchased material. After measuring all 18 girls, Minmin traced out the material. Then our staff

started cutting. We had to have sharp scissors, because we did not dare to damage any of the material.

After the shapes were cut out, Minmin approached the sewing machine. After she'd assembled many sections, Elvie and the other ladies cut-out the pre-embroidered button holes. They sewed on the buttons by hand, and also inserted the plaid cloth belts. School secretaries, janitors, teachers and cooks all worked together to get the project done by the deadline.

On Saturday afternoon, Elvie came over to the house from the school, to get lunch together for the crowd of makeshift seamstresses and tailors. "Minmin and the staff are staying over the weekend to get the job finished by Monday!" She exclaimed, all out of breath. "I am helping them, so you won't see me the rest of the day." Late into the evening, and from after church let out on Sunday morning until Sunday night, they labored.

Finally, in the wee hours of Monday morning, with many of the teachers asleep on the floor of their classrooms, the last button was sewn-on and the last belt was attached. Finished! Finally!

Of course, I was asleep when they got done. So the next morning, when I stepped out of the house (we live right next to the school), I was amazed to see the awesome, fresh, crisp, pressed, new uniforms on our students.

"Whoa! You look awesome!" I expressed to one of the kids. She just smiled, responding with a humble, "I know!"
