TYHOON PABLO (BOPHA) HIT THE PHILIPPINES ON DECEMBER 4. OVER SIX THOUSAND TRIBAL PEOPLE DIED, HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS BECAME HOMELESS, AND OVER FIVE MILLION FILIPINOS' LIVES WERE DRASTICALLY ALTERED. ROADS AND BRIDGES WERE WASHED OUT, AND ELECTRICITY AND CLEAN WATER CEASED TO EXIST. ENTIRE COCONUT FORESTS WERE



DEMOLISHED BY 130 MPH WINDS AND TORRENTIAL RAIN. A FRIEND WHO'D GONE TO THE AREA TO BURY HIS DAD HAD TO CARRY THE CASKET ACROSS FLOODED RIVERS. OUR OWN HOME HAD KNEE-DEEP MUDDY WATER INSIDE, AND ABBY IRONED HER HOMEWORK TO DRY IT OUT. AT AN EMERGENC KIWANIS MEETING, ELVIE AND I OFFERED A CLASS ROOM IN OUR SCHOOL



TO PROCESS FOODSTUFFS FOR THE TYPHOON SURVIVIORS. THAT AFTERNOON TRUCKS ARRIVED WITH RICE, CANNED FISH, PACKETS OF NOODLES, A GENERATOR, AND OTHER SURVIVAL ITEMS, INCLUDING OVER A TON OF BOTTLED WATER! NEARLY A HUNDRED ADULTS, CHILDREN AND COLLEGE STUDENTS CAME BY TO PACK UP THE AID. THEN TRUCKS ARRIVED (WITH



MILITARY ESCORT) TO BRING ELVIE AND THE AID TO THE WORST-HIT AREAS OF CATEEL AND NEW BATAAN, A MEETING WITH THE LOCAL MAYOR REVEALED HIS PLAN OF AID ROTATION SO NOBODY WOULD GO HUNGRY, KIWANIS WORKED SIDE-BY-SIDE WITH UNITED NATIONS, RED CROSS, US AID AND OTHER GROUPS, THEY FOUND ONE BOY WHO NEEDED STITCHES, AND



AFTERWARD VISITED A HOSPITAL. THEN THEY STARTED-UP A SOUP KITCHEN. AFTER RUNNING OUT OF RICE SOUP, ELVIE PLAYED GAMES WITH THE KIDS, MANY WHO'D LOST THEIR FATHERS IN THE MINES WHEN THE FLOODS CAME. ON HER EIGHT-HOUR RIDE HOME, ELVIE CONSIDERED CHRIST'S WORDS, "WHATSOEVER YOU'VE DONE FOR THESE, YOU DID FOR ME."
